## NOTICE.

## Notice to Trainers and Jockeys.

A.J.C. Rule 159.—“ Any objection against a Horse on the ground of interference, cross, jostle, or any improper act on the part of his jockey or rider, or of his not having run the proper course, or of the race having been run over a wrong course, or of any other matter occurring in the race, must be made to one of the Stewards, or the Secretary of the Club, or Clerk of Scales before the jockey or rider of the horse whose owner, nominator, trainer, jockey, or rider prefers the objection is weighed in, and may be made verbally, or in writing, without any deposit. In the event of any such objection being deemed frivolous by the Stewards, they may fine the person making the objection a sum not exceeding Five Pounds.”

All horses must be at the Starting Post two minutes before the allotted time for starting. No excuse will be taken for any default, and a fine of not less than £1 will be inflicted for such default.

All persons intending to withdraw horses are required to give notice in writing to that effect to the official appointed to receive scratchings at least half an hour before the time appointed for starting, otherwise a fine for late scratching will be inflicted.

Trainers must have their horses in the weighing yard, saddled and ready to go to the post, at least minutes before time appointed for starting.

## PENALTIES.

A Winner of any handicap flat race after the declaration of weights to carry a 7lbs. penalty; of two or more such handicaps 10lbs. penalty, unless otherwise provided.

**Information for Totalisator Investors.**

No Person under the age of 21 years is permitted to bet on the Totalisator, vide Section 12 of "Totalisator Act, 1916," as follows:

"If any person under the age of Twenty-one years wagers, by means of the totalisator, he shall be liable to a penalty of not less than one pound nor more than twenty pounds for the first offence, and not less than five pounds nor more than fifty pounds for each subsequent offence."

The Totalisator is closed at the time notified in the Race Books for the Race to Start, and no investment will be received after that time.

A warning bell will ring at the Totalisator Ten minutes before closing time, and also prior to closing; the Machine will close one minute after the second bell stops ringing.

Each horse starting in a race will be denoted on the Totalisator by a number corresponding with its number in the Race Book.

The Totalisator pays First and Second horses when five and not more than eight horses start, at the rate of 75 per cent, and 25 per cent, respectively; and pays First (60 per cent.), Second (20 per cent.) and Third (20 per cent.) when there are nine or more starters.

Tickets on any horse in any race may be purchased at each selling window.

Tickets are sold at Five Shillings, which is the unit of investment.

An investor may invest an unlimited amount on any horse.

No change will be given, except at the windows set apart for the purpose.

Every investor should see that he gets the proper change, ticket, or dividend before leaving the window, as no claims will be recognised afterwards.

All dividends are calculated on the unit of investments, and will be exhibited on the Totalisators. The unit of investment is 5/.

No dividend will be paid unless on the production of a ticket not mutilated or defaced, except by order of the Committee.

All Dividends must be collected at the Pay Out windows of the Totalisator, and not later than half an hour after the declaration of the dividend on the last race of the day.

Dividends not collected on the day of the race may be collected at the office of M.T.C., on a day to be fixed by the Committee of the M.T.C. within a period of one month from the date of the race meeting.

In the event of the Committee declaring all investments off, the moneys invested will be returned to investors.

Every investor and holder of a ticket shall be deemed to have made himself acquainted with the Rules and Conditions of the Totalisator, which are exhibited on the Totalisators, and to have agreed to be bound thereby.

The Committee reserve the right to postpone the times notified in this Race Card for closing the Totalisator and starting the race if circumstances in their opinion warrant their doing so.
